Assessment of your proposal

The research project proposal was put forward by the EB and was assessed on scientific quality, innovation and valorisation potential as well as on technical feasibility by the ARC CBBC international Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) appointed by NWO. Having received feedback from the SAB, the EB decided that the project proposal is eligible for funding.

Financial conditions



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The maximum budget allocated for this project is: € 5.1.2b excl. VAT (btw), if applicable) to cover project-related costs such as salary costs, training, consumables, senior guidance, infrastructure, equipment and overhead fees. The host institution is responsible for assessing if VAT (btw) is applicable and must inform the ARC CBBC Support Office at project start.

Each year, on the 1st of February, a financial report is due, which is a condition for budget transfer. The format for financial reporting can be found in Supporting Documents. Please be advised that 7.65% of the maximum funds assigned will be withheld as contribution to the ARC CBBC Support Office and as provision for contingencies; Full Public Partners (RUG, TU/e, UU) already are exempt as this is accounted for in the full partner financing. During the project, 80% of the maximum funding will be made available. The remaining part will be transferred after the final project reports are approved by the Executive Board.

Conditions

The project is part of ARC CBBC. All terms and conditions of the ARC CBBC Consortium Agreement, to which your institution is a partner, will be applicable. The agreement can be found in the Supporting Documents.

Progress reports

In particular, I would like to draw your attention to the following. You are responsible for providing a progress report for both NWO and TKI over the entire project of the previous year, before January 31st. Furthermore, a midterm and end term evaluation will be required. ARC CBBC will monitor project progress and you should inform the support office of any significant deviation of project plans in advance.

Employment

The research positions granted should be appointed as employees with the host institution, in agreement with their employment conditions. The host institution is responsible for providing adequate supervision, as well as for providing the research infrastructure needed for the project. Job advertisement relating to new positions in this project should also be provided to be published on the ARC CBBC website.
