Thank you for your recent email regarding the student 5.1.2e. The Board of Examiners (BoE) for the Advanced Master Programmes met this morning and deliberated on the case. The BoE feel that there is not sufficient evidence to conclude any wrongdoing. More evidence, such as the Turnitin report or further examples of where plagiarism is suspected, would be needed. What is suspected, based on the evidence provided, is that the student has tried extremely hard to avoid any form of plagiarism to the extent that it has raised suspicions. Additionally, although the student has admitted to seeking help with the citations, etc., there is no evidence of the extent of this and if anything else was done by the friend. In reality, it is impossible to control this and it is not forbidden for students to ask their cohort to review their work.
