The referral to the Board of Examiners does indeed freeze the grading process.

As to the other question, I think that when drafting the provisions in the Course and Examination Regulation concerning the grading term, this particular situation was not taken into account. Pursuant to the Course and Examination Regulations,

(Oddly enough, the Dutch version version of the Course and Examination Regulations differs from the English version, in that according to the Dutch version, in case the examiner is unable to comply with the term of fifteen working days, s/he should ask the Vice Dean for an extension.)

I think that the grading term of fifteen working days in general indeed begins if the student's thesis is deemed not to be in violation of the university's rules. I also think that the start of the grading term is postponed or the grading term suspended if the examiners are on vacation, because in that case, the examiners must be deemed to be unable to comply with the term of fifteen working days.

In all cases, however, I think that if at all possible, the grade should be recorded in uSis before the end of August/the start of the new academic year.

I received this email from 5.1.2e requesting 5.1.2e grade in the interim (see below).

My understanding was that the referral to the exam commission resulted in a freezing of the grading procedure (i.e. myself and the second reader have not yet assessed 5.1.2e work). Please confirm that this is indeed the correct course of action.

In addition, one thing that is unclear to me is when the OER grading term (15 working days, if I am not mistaken) begins if 5.1.2e thesis is deemed to not be in violation of the university's rules. This is a bit complicated by the fact that this is normally our teaching free time in the department, so it would be helpful to have guidance so I can inform the second reader accordingly as well.

I've cc'ed 5.1.2e as I am sure there are other cases of a referral this year and for future reference, as our thesis coordinator.
